GUIDELINES

1. The text should be normalized computer script: **B5**, all margins: **2 cm**, font: **TNR 12**, single interline. The font in the footnotes : **TNR 10**.
2. The articles and source editions should not exceed **30 pages**.
3. Reviews, discussions and reports should not exceed **10 pages**.
4. Review articles and polemics should not exceed **20 pages**.
5. No formatting or graphic highlighting should be applied in the articles.
6. For citations brackets should be used.
7. The titles of the publications and foreign phrases should be distinguished with cursive.
8. From HiS 5/2016 manuscripts must be in: **English, German, Russian, Italian, Spanish or French**.
9. Each article or source edition should contain a summary up to **1500 characters** including spaces. Summary must be in **English**.

10. Footnotes should be Word generated at the bottom of the page. References in the text should be placed before the dot ending the sentence, or a comma when the reference is inside the sentence, except for the situation when the sentence is ended by the abbreviation. The numbers of the footnotes and references should be placed in upper index without unnecessary brackets and dots after the numbers. Bibliography should be placed at the end of the article.

11. Required bibliographical notes - according to simplified system e.g:

a/ **in footnotes:** Maksymiuk (2012) 66

b/ **in bibliography:**

12. When quoting Internet resources we write: Author, the title (if there is none, it should be given one), exact address and access date.

13. Photographs in .jpg format, resolution **300 dpi**.
